### ***The need to support sustainable reconstruction***

*The EU funded REBUILD Project aims to support sustainable reconstruction efforts in **regions affected by war or natural disasters**, while also aligning with the EU Green Deal and Digital Decade objectives. REBUILD is an international capacity-building project in vocational education and training (VET) that brings together EU countries (Italy, Austria, Poland) and Eastern European nations (Ukraine, Moldova, Georgia).*

### ***Main objectives***

*At its core, REBUILD aims to strengthen cooperation between European and Eastern Partnership countries, fostering the **exchange of best practices in construction and training**.*

*A key focus is on equipping VET trainers with the necessary skills to **integrate digital tools**, energy-efficient building techniques, and innovative teaching methods into their programs. This includes the development of MOOCs and online learning platforms, ensuring broad and continuous access to high-quality training resources.*

*Another important aspect of the project is the **collaboration with the private sector**, encouraging construction companies to actively participate in sustainable rebuilding efforts. By bridging the gap between education and industry, REBUILD ensures that training programs are aligned with real labour market needs.*

*Additionally, the initiative promotes **international exchanges and study visits**, creating opportunities for cross-border cooperation and knowledge-sharing among VET trainers and institutions. This approach not only enhances professional development but also contributes to a more resilient and future-oriented construction sector.*

### ***Virtual Study Visits***

*In the first part of the project (started in January 2025), within Work Package 2 (**Deepening Knowledge through Targeted Analyses**), led by University of Bologna, partners from **target countries (Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine)** are carrying out analysis on:*

- *Defining and assessing the impact of Catastrophic Events*
- *Analysis of widespread reconstruction procedures in target countries*
- *State of vocational training*

*Results of the analysis will be presented during the **Virtual Study Visits**.*
